NOTICE OF HEARING FOR ADOPTION OF COMMISSION REGULATIONS

The Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners will hold a public hearing at 08:30 am on Saturday, June 29, 2024. The meeting will be held at the Pershing County Community Center 820 6th Street Lovelock, NV 89419. The purpose of the hearing is to receive comments from all interested persons regarding the adoption of commission regulations. If a person who is directly affected by the proposed action fails to appear to request to make an oral presentation, the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners may proceed immediately to act upon any written submissions.

Due to technical limitations at the meeting location, the meeting will NOT be broadcast live or have virtual participation.

Commission Regulation 23-15 Amendment #1, Fishing Seasons and Regulations for January 1, 2024, through December 31, 2025

The Commission will consider amending CR 23-15 to designate Smith Creek Reservoir as a closed water in Lander County.

Commission Regulation 24-05, Amendment #1, 2025 Heritage Tag Vendors

The Commission will review the Wildlife Heritage Committee's recommendations regarding Heritage Tag Vendor Proposals for 2025 and may take action on the proposals.

Commission Regulation 24-13, 2024-2025 & 2025-2026 Upland Game and Furbearer Seasons and Bag Limits

The Commission will establish and may vote to adopt regulations for upland game birds and mammals, furbearers, and wild turkey for the 2024-2025 and 2025-2026 seasons.

The regulation dates and language are subject to change following the discussions and deliberations of the Commission.

Persons wishing to comment upon the proposed action of the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners may appear at the scheduled public hearing or submit their comments at the appropriate times to the following email address: wildlifecommission@ndow.org or in written form, to the Secretary of the Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners, 6980 Sierra Center Parkway, Suite 120, Reno, Nevada 89511. Written submissions must be received at least five days before the scheduled public hearing.

Stewart Street, Carson City, Nevada and at each Nevada county public library, in which an office of the agency is not maintained, for inspection by members of the public during business hours. Copies will be mailed to members of the public upon request. A reasonable fee may be charged for copies if it is deemed necessary.

**FISHING SEASONS
CR 23-15 Amendment 1**

The Board of Wildlife Commissioners, under the authority of 501.181 of the Nevada Revised Statutes, does hereby adopt the following regulation for the management of the fisheries resource:

**2024/2025 FISHING SEASONS
JANUARY 1, 2024 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2025**

LIMITS

“Daily Limit” means the maximum number of game fish that may be lawfully taken and reduced to possession by a person in one day. The “Possession Limit” is two times the daily limit for the water in which the fish were caught. A daily/possession limit includes fish caught in Nevada which have been processed or preserved and are stored at any location. Fish that are caught and immediately released back to the water alive are not considered to be reduced to possession or part of the limit.

A person shall not reduce game fish to possession if he already has the number of that fish in possession which equals or exceeds the possession limit of the water being fished.

General limits are listed by region. Exceptions to general limits are included as “special regulations” and are listed by individual water.

CR 24-05 2025 Wildlife Heritage Tag Amendment #1

The Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners, under the authority of Section 501.181, 502.140, 502.250 and 503.140 of the Nevada Revised Statutes (NRS), does hereby adopt the following regulation for the management of wildlife resources in the State of Nevada.

Wildlife Heritage Tags

Hunting Hours: Big game mammals and wild turkey may be hunted from one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset as listed on government sunrise-sunset tables.

Take Limit: One animal allowed per tag.

Legal Weapon: Any legal firearm or bow as described in NRS 503.150 and Nevada Administrative Code (NAC) 503.141, 503.142, 503.143 and 503.144 may be used throughout the big game season. Additionally, any legal weapon or shotgun or bow as described in NAC 503.187 may be used throughout the wild turkey season.

Exclusions: Heritage Tags exclude the use of seasons, quotas and hunt units designated for depredation, management, and emergency hunts.

Unit Closures: The Tag Allocation and Application Hunt Committee and Commission directive on unit closures is associated with the setting of the annual bighorn sheep quotas and the following table that identifies the maximum number of specialty tags for every unit group that has an open season. Some unit groups may be set to zero (0) if they are not able to sustain additional ram harvest beyond the general draw's tag quota. Maximum Specialty Tag Quotas reflect the combination of the Heritage, Dream, Silver State, and Partnership in Wildlife tags.

The number is 1-833-923-0754 and is accessible 24 hours a day. The Nevada Department of Wildlife phone number to call and report a harvested bighorn sheep is 775-688-2327. Sheep harvests must be reported by 9:00PM Pacific Time the day of harvest.

In the instance that an approved Heritage Tag vendor is unable to hold an event [or finalize the full bid amount](#) where a Heritage Tag is scheduled to be sold, the Board of Wildlife Commission grants authority to the Department to allocate the tag(s) to a different Commission approved Heritage Tag vendor for the corresponding year who has the ability to hold their event and offer for auction the Heritage Tags.

[In the event a Heritage tag holder requests a return of the purchased Heritage tag for medical, military, or death reasons pursuant to NAC 502.422, the Department may refund the corresponding tag fee for the species designated on the tag but will not refund the bid amount received through auction.](#)

The Nevada Board of Wildlife Commissioners hereby delegates authority to the Nevada Department of Wildlife to adjust season dates to accommodate Department of Defense operations so long as there is no change to the overall length of the season.

Hunt units mentioned below reflect the general hunt seasons. If the hunt units mentioned below are closed to the general hunt season, they are also closed to specialty tags.

* There are portions of hunt unit 181 in Naval Air Station (NAS) Fallon where public access is restricted. To hunt Nelson (desert) bighorn sheep in the NAS portions of this unit, the tag holder is required to attend a NAS hunter safety briefing. Those portions of hunt unit 181 that do not fall within the boundaries of NAS Fallon are open to the public.

* Portions of Hunt Units 252, 280, 281, 282 are within the Nevada Test and Training Range (NTTR) where public access is restricted. Hunters and everyone in their respective hunting parties must comply with all Nevada hunting requirements and all NTTR safety and security requirements including the following: 1) consent to and pass a criminal history background check; 2) be at least 14 years old on opening day of the respective hunting season; 3) attend the Nellis Air Force Base hunter safety briefing; and 4) within the NTTR Hunt Units 252, 280, 281, 282

limit party size to 5 including tag holder. Additional party members may complete background check and safety briefing, but only maximum of 5 party members including tag holder may be present within the NTTR Hunt Units 252, 280, 281, 282 at any given time. Those portions of Hunt Units 252, 280, 281, 282 that do not fall within the boundaries of NTTR are open to the public.

* Hunters and members of their parties who fail to comply with these requirements may be denied access to the NTTR. Hunters and members of their parties may not access the NTTR after a tag is filled and animal has been removed and in possession of tag holder. No pets are allowed on NTTR. It is the hunter's responsibility to meet and/or comply with all NTTR eligibility requirements. In some units there may be adjustments to season dates to accommodate Department of Defense operations.
