Beatty Pond

FISHERY AND STOCKING INFORMATION

General information: Beatty Pond is located approximately 2 miles south of the town of Beatty at US 95 and Vanderbilt Road. The pond used to be part of a gravel pit operated by the Nye County Road Department. The pond is spring fed from a shallow well with cattails along its edges. It is stocked with Rainbow Trout during the winter months. The pond may have resident bass, Bluegill, and catfish from previous stockings sometime after its construction in 1977.

Location: US 95 and Vanderbilt Road, Nye County.

Size: The pond is approximately 3 surface acres.

Management: Nevada Department of Wildlife manages the fishery as a Cold Water Put-and-Take Fishery during the colder months. The pond is located on BLM land.

General Information

- No entrance fees.
- No restrooms.
- Dirt path leading to the pond.
- Cattails around much of the perimeter.

Regulations

- A fishing license is required for anglers 12 years of age or older.
- Season is open year-round.
- The Daily Limit is 3 game fish.
- The Possession Limit is 2 times the daily limit of the water being fished.
- The use of bait fish is prohibited, except for preserved salmon eggs.

Fishing Notes

- Angling for stocked trout is best within a week of stocking, though holdover fish may remain from previous stockings.
- Fishing slows in late spring and fall as water temperatures change during seasonal transitions.
- Small spinners, Power Bait, and salmon eggs are effective for catching trout.
- Try spinners and worms for Largemouth Bass.
