
Boulder City Pond

FISHERY AND STOCKING INFORMATION





General information: The Boulder City Pond is located in the Veterans' Memorial Park in Boulder City. The pond was constructed in 2001 as a joint project between Boulder City and Nevada Department of Wildlife to provide the opportunity for anglers to fish. The primary fishing is comprised of Rainbow Trout and Channel Catfish, with catchable-sized fish stocked seasonally. Bluegills are also stocked occasionally. There is no stocking in July due to excessive heat. The park is open 5 a.m. to 10 p.m., and there is no fee for park entrance.

Location: 1650 Buchanan Blvd, Boulder City, Clark County.

Size: The pond is approximately 3 surface acres with a maximum depth of 15 feet.

Management: Nevada Department of Wildlife manages the fishery as a Cold Water Urban Fishery during the colder months and a Warm Water Urban Fishery during the warmer months of the year. The pond and park are managed by the City of Boulder City.

• Note: Only the upper pond is for fishing.

Regulations

- A fishing license is required for anglers
 12 years of age or older.
- Season is open year-round during park hours only.
- The Daily Limit is 3 game fish.
- The Possession Limit is 2 times the daily limit of the water being fished.
- The use of live bait is prohibited.

Fishing Notes

- The 2024 average catch rates for this pond from interviewed anglers were 1.3 fish/hour and 2.5 fish/angler day.
- Angling for stocked trout and catfish is best within a week of stocking, though holdover fish may remain from previous stockings.
- Fishing slows in late spring (April) and late fall (October) as water temperatures change during the transition of seasons.
- Small spinners, Power Bait, salmon eggs, marshmallows, and flies are effective for catching Rainbow Trout.
- Prepared catfish baits, hot dogs, shrimp, and chicken liver have been used successfully to catch Channel Catfish.
- Red worms are a good bait choice for catching Bluegill.

Boating Regulations

Boats and other flotation devices, including float tubes are prohibited.
