

**Species:** Desert Bighorn Sheep

**Unit Group:** 267

**Access:** Unit 267 is situated in central Clark County and is comprised primarily of the Black Mountains which exists south of State Route 167 (North Shore Road) and north of Lake Mead from Callville Bay Road on the west and extending east and north to Echo Bay. The remaining area north of Echo Bay in Unit 267 has few if any bighorn sheep. Topographic features vary from rolling hills on the western margin of bighorn sheep habitat to the sheer, vertical cliffs of the Cathedral Peaks. The Black Mountains are within the Lake Mead National Recreation Area and are administered by the National Park Service. Hunter access may be considered fair to good. Some hunters opt to use boats to learn their area, and to access points which would otherwise be more difficult to reach on foot. Please be aware that sections of this unit are in a wilderness area. Motorized equipment, mechanized transport, including wheeled game carriers and chainsaws, are prohibited in wilderness areas. Contact the Lake Mead National Park Service for more information.

**Recommended Hunting Areas:** Cathedral Peaks, points accessed by Boathouse Cove Road, Pinto Ridge and Razorback Ridge.

**Biologist Comments:** Full services are available in Henderson and Las Vegas, and many are available in Boulder City. Some services are available at Echo Bay and Callville Bay. Generally, primitive camping is the rule. All bighorn sheep hunters should contact the National Park Service (702) 293-8908 or (702) 293-8905 for information on rules and regulations.
