Access:

Access is readily available on the numerous federal, state, county, USFS, and BLM roads throughout the unit group. Access to Ruby Lake National Wildlife Refuge is not permitted for the hunting of big game species. Private properties preclude public access in Clover Valley (Unit 101) and portions of Ruby Valley (Unit 102).

Recommended Hunting Areas:

Antelope in this unit group are widely scattered and well distributed throughout each associated hunt unit. Antelope are found in Huntington, Newark, Ruby, Long, Butte, and Clover Valleys. Antelope are typically associated with private agricultural fields, the Ruby Lake National Wildlife Refuge, and/or with the scattered natural and manmade water sources (guzzlers). Overutilization by wild horses continues to plague much of this unit group, hunters should seek out those portions of the area that still support suitable vegetative conditions.

Biologist Comments:

The towns of Elko, Ely, Eureka, Spring Creek, and Wells provide access to groceries, fuel, lodging, and other amenities. There are numerous RV parks in Elko, Ely, Eureka, and Wells with varying degrees of availability and services provided. Improved campgrounds operated by the USFS include Angel Creek (Unit 101), Angel Lake (Unit 101), Thomas Canyon (Unit 102), and South Ruby (Unit 103). Dispersed camping opportunities are readily available on other federally managed lands throughout the unit group.
