Access:

Access is excellent to all hunting areas with many roads. Private alfalfa farms and native pastures are found primarily in Fish Lake Valley and rarely block access to public lands. Many roads are unimproved two-tracks and four-wheel drive vehicles with good clearance are recommended.

Recommended Hunting Areas:

Antelope are generally found associated with water sources during the hunting season, although precipitation can scatter animals widely. Perennial streams, springs, livestock waters, and artificial water developments are good places for hunters to locate sign and find concentrations of antelope. The highest densities of antelope can usually be found in Montezuma Valley, in and around the Monte Cristo Range, and in Lida Valley. Lower numbers of animals can typically be found in Fish Lake Valley and scattered throughout the remainder of the unit group. Special care should be taken to be familiar with hunt unit boundaries and county roads, as animals regularly move between Units 211-212 and adjacent units.
